

Welcome to Mariemont Players

The Mariemont Players (MPI) was formed 87 years ago as a church group that performed plays in the village of Mariemont, Ohio. Founded in 1936, the group began a regular season of performances in the 1950s and was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization on August 28, 1956 by its president, Woodrow (Woody) Jarrett. In honor of Woody & Lois Jarrett's longtime commitment to the theater, the auditorium is named for them.

In 1960, for slightly more than \$8000, the group bought the old Plainville four-room school building. Volunteer members have been converting the structure into the Walton Creek Theater ever since. The original cornerstone was laid in 1869, but the present solid brick building at the intersection of Walton Creek and Muchmore Roads dates from 1910. We're fortunate to be one of the few local community theaters with a permanent home. Our continuing improvements to the building include a remodeled auditorium with new seating, aisle lights and an electromagnetic hearing loop for the hearing-impaired. Our elevator to the auditorium accommodates those with physical handicaps, including wheelchairs. A handicap accessible restroom is on the first floor.

The Players have had 1000s of members during the past 85 years. Some have even become film actors, Broadway musical directors and played roles in professional theater, TV commercials, corporate videos and voice-overs plus dozens of support roles in media and the creative arts.

We could all use a laugh these days.

Whether it's due to stress, anxiety, or cabin fever after all of the snow – we are in dire need of a good laugh. Thank goodness we have comedy, and there is no comedy better suited to our current situation than *Moon over Buffalo*, one of the best comedy scripts ever produced, the work of master comic playwright Ken Ludwig.

The Village Players



Hearing Loops allow people who wear hearing aids to directly receive the sound from the stage microphones in their own hearing aids. If your hearing aids have a wireless receiver called a T-coil or telecoil, just switch it on. Talk to your audiologist to see if your instruments are so equipped and how to activate it. Many hearing devices can have either a T (no background noise pickup) or MT program (blended microphone and T-coil program).

If your hearing aid doesn't have a telecoil, you may borrow a separate loop receiver with a headset, available in the first floor lobby. Ask an usher if you would like to use one.

With the continued presence of Covid in our lives, Mariemont Players has instituted an understudy program. The understudy committee is building and maintaining a list of actors/actresses willing to step into a show in an emergency. Early in the rehearsal process each director will choose actors from the list who might be appropriate for the major roles in their show. We are hopeful that this added measure will safeguard our performances and greatly lower the chances of MPI needing to cancel shows during a run. It has already been used successfully on several occasions.

If an understudy needs to go on you will see them with a script in hand, but be assured that they have attended rehearsals to familiarize themselves with the show's concept, blocking, and pacing so that, if called upon, they are confident and able to perform with little notice.

Ken Ludwig has had 6 productions on Broadway and 8 in London's West End. His 34 plays and musicals are staged around the world and throughout the United States every night of the year.

His first play, *Lend Me A Tenor*, won 2 Tony Awards and was called"one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. *Crazy for You* is currently running on London's West End. It was previously on Broadway for 5 years, on the West End for 3, and won Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical. In addition, he has won the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theatre, 2 Laurence Olivier Awards, 2 Helen Hates Awards, the Charles MacArthur Award and the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year. His other plays include *Moon Over Buffalo, Leading Ladies, Baskerville, Sherwood, Twentieth Century, dear Jack, Dear Louise, A Fox on the Fairway, A Comedy of Tenors, The Game's Afoot, Shakespeare in Hollywood, and Murder on the Orient Express.* They have starred, among many others, Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Kristen Bell, Tony Shaloub, Joan Collins and Henry Goodman.

His book, <u>How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare</u>, published by Penguin Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays on theatre are published in the Yale review. He gives the Annual Ken Ludwig Playwriting Scholarship at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival, and he served on the Board of Governors of the Folger Library for 10 years. His first opera, *Tenor Overboard*, opened at the Glimmerglass Festival in July 2022. His most recent world premieres were Lend Me A Soprano and Moriarity, and his newest plays and musicals include Pride and Prejudice Part 2: Napoleon at Pemberley and Lady Molly of Scotland. Yard.






